- **7 Remaining Priority Political Subdivisions**

- November/December 2024 – UCS sent letters requesting capital plan amendments to fourteen (14) Priority political subdivisions. These cities/counties had either chronic problems or ongoing/past capital work that needed approval.
- The Board has approved capital plan amendments from six (6) of these political subdivisions.
