- **14 Priority Political Subdivisions**

- November/December 2024 – UCS sent letters requesting capital plan amendments. These cities/counties had either chronic problems or ongoing/past capital work that needed approval.
- The Board has approved capital plan amendments from five (5) of these political subdivisions.
